Burlington County Parks Naturalist, Kate Szostak will be giving a PowerPoint nature lecture on nocturnal wildlife. Kate is responsible for preparing and conducting nature and environmental education programs for the general public of all ages. In addition, Kate is in charge of the safe capture and

transport of injured wildlife within the parks to local wildlife rehabilitation facilities and is in charge of the blue bird nest box monitoring program. Kate has also conducted field research on northern diamondback terrapins in Barnegat Bay and has had her abstract published in the New Jersey Academy of Science.
